Jose G. Sanvictores was born in 1887 in the city of Rizal, Philippines. In 1903, with the passing of the Pensionados Act Jose was one of 103 students selected to attend college in the U.S in 1904, Jose Sanvictores began attending the University of Illinois as one of the five first Filipinos to attend the institution and majored in agriculture. In 1906, Jose was awarded the Hazleton medal. Jose Sanvictores was appointed as a representative for the House of Representatives of the Philippine government from 1928 to 1934. Jose was selected to be a delegate to attend the 1935 Constitutional Convention, essentially becoming one of the framers of the Philippine Constitution. He survived the occupation of Japan during World War II. He was the founder and CEO of SEACOM Incorporated, A nationwide trading company in the Philippines. Jose passed away in 1979 at the age of 92.
